A strengths & challenges checklist

Strengths



- Visual**
Learns best when they see and experience information
- Creative**
Innovative and comes up with new ways of doing things
- Observant**
Sees things others may not
- Interests**
Works best when the information is relevant and interesting to them
- Focus**
Excels when they are taught with a strength-based focus that is engaging and their challenges are addressed
- Empathy**
Sees things others may not
- Thinking**
Excellent big-picture thinkers
- Connections**
Good at making connections
- Reasoning**
Strong narrative reasoning
- Problem Solving**
Enjoys working through challenges

Challenges



- Instructions**
Gets overwhelmed with too many words - verbal instructions
- Language**
Have not developed a strong vocabulary because they avoid reading
- Word processing**
Skips words and lines when reading
- Memory**
Their memory for what they hear and read is often weak - sometimes referred to as working memory
- Speed**
Processing speed is slower than grade-level expectations
- Behavior**
May be very anxious & frustrated
- Attention**
Struggles to pay attention when work is boring or frustrating
- Reading comprehension**
Silent reading comprehension is difficult
- Sight words**
Difficulty learning and remembering high frequency or sight words

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
